Components:	10 x 50 µl HMS174(DE3) competent cells 1 x 10 µl pUC18 plasmid (concentration 0.02 ng/µl)
Storage:	Store at -70°C. Thaw only during use. Do not re-freeze.
Stability:	When stored and used as directed, a transformation efficiency greater than 1×10^7 colonies/µg of test plasmid is guaranteed for 6 months from the date of shipment.

Test conditions:	Thaw an aliquot of CaCl ₂ competent cells on ice (for up to 10 minutes). Add 0.2 ng (10µl) of plasmid DNA vector containing the gene of interest to a 50 µl aliquot of the cells. Mix by tapping the tube gently. Incubate the tube on ice for 20 minutes. Place the tube at 42°C for 2 minutes; then put it back on ice for 3 minutes. Add 440 µl of LB medium and incubate the tube for 1 hour at 37°C. Spread 100 µl of the transformation mix on LB-agar Petri plates containing ampicillin. Incubate the Petri plates at 37°C for up to 20 hours.

To maximise protein expression, fresh transformants are strongly recommended.
